

A1: CEFR Global Scale

1.1 Global Scale

- Can understand and use familiar everyday expressions and very basic phrases aimed at the satisfaction of needs of a concrete type.
- Can introduce him/herself and others and can ask and answer questions about personal details such as where he/she lives, people he/she knows and things he/she has.
- Can interact in a simple way provided the other person talks slowly and clearly and is prepared to help.

1.2 Self-assessment grid

Reception / Listening I can recognise familiar words and very basic phrases concerning myself, my family and immediate concrete surroundings when people speak slowly and clearly.	A1
Reception Reading I can understand familiar names, words and very simple sentences, for example on notices and posters or in catalogues.	A1
<i>Interaction Spoken</i> I can interact in a simple way provided the other person is prepared to repeat or rephrase things at a slower rate of speech and help me formulate what I'm trying to say. I can ask and answer simple questions in areas of immediate need or on very familiar topics.	A1
<i>Interaction Written</i> I can write a short, simple postcard, for examples sending holiday greetings. I can fill in forms with personal details, for example entering my name, nationality and address on a hotel registration form.	A1
Production Spoken I can use simple phrases and sentences to describe where I live and people I know.	A1

1.3 Qualitative aspects of spoken language use

Has a very basic repertoire of words and simple phrases related to personal details and particular concrete situations.

ACCURACY



Shows only limited control of a few simple grammatical structures and sentence patterns in a memorised repertoire.

FLUENCY

Can manage very short, isolated, mainly pre-packaged utterances, with much pausing to search for expressions, to articulate less familiar words, and to repair communication.

INTERACTION

Can ask and answer questions about personal details. Can interact in a simple way but communication is totally dependent on repetition, rephrasing and repair.

COHERENCE

Can link words or groups of words with very basic linear connectors like "and" or "then".

OVERALL SPOKEN INTERACTION Can interact in a simple way but communication is totally dependent on repetition at a slower rate of speech, rephrasing and repair. Can ask and answer simple questions, initiate and respond to simple statements in areas of immediate need or on very familiar topics.	A1

INTERVIEWING AND BEING INTERVIEWED Can reply in an interview to simple direct questions spoken very slowly and clearly in direct non-idiomatic speech about personal details.	A1
OVERALL SPOKEN PRODUCTION Can produce simple mainly isolated phrases about people and places.	A1
SUSTAINED MONOLOGUE: Describing Experience Can describe him/herself, what he/she does and where he/she lives.	A1
ADDRESSING AUDIENCES Can read a very short, rehearsed statement - e.g. to introduce a speaker, propose a toast.	A1

2.2 Working with text

PROCESSING TEXT



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Can follow speech that is very slow and carefully articulated, with long pauses for him/her to assimilate meaning.	
NOTES, MESSAGES & FORMS Can write numbers and dates, own name, nationality, address, age, date of birth or arrival in the country etc. such as on a hotel registration form.	A1
OVERALL WRITTEN PRODUCTION Can write simple isolated phrases and sentences. Can ask for or pass on personal details in written form	A1
CREATIVE WRITING Can write simple phrases and sentences about themselves and imaginary people, where they live and what they do.	A1

GENERAL LINGUISTIC RANGE Has a very basic range of simple expressions about personal details and needs of a concrete type.	A1	
VOCABULARY RANGE Has a basic vocabulary repertoire of isolated words and phrases related to particular concrete situations	A1	
GRAMMATICAL ACCURACY Shows only limited control of a few simple grammatical structures and sentence patterns in a learnt repertoire.	A1	
PHONOLOGICAL CONTROL Pronunciation of a very limited repertoire of learnt words and phrases can be understood with some effort by native speakers used to dealing with speakers of his/her language	A1	
ORTHOGRAPHIC CONTROL Can copy familiar words and short phrases e.g. simple signs or instructions, names of everyday objects, names of shops and set phrases used regularly.	A1
